- An open, vivid campus brings together not just us working for the university, but also our partners, companies, visitors and citizens




Things to consider

 - Remember to remain generally cautious







Answers to your questions

Q's and A's

- What happens to the student organisations and can we participate in the development process of their premises?
 - Students have the possibility to participate in the planning of our new premises. We aim to have premises for student organisations in some of the buildings.
- Will there be a "technical" premise for studying / hobbies in the spirit of makerspace?
 - One of our goals is to improve space efficiency. We aim to have also premises of this kind.



More Q's

- How is sustainability considered? (recycling etc.)
 - We already have a workgroup for sustainable development working on the subject. Besides that, our university aims to be carbon neutral in 2030, which means that this theme follows us in every way.
- How is digitalization considered?
 - Digitalization is one enabler to achieve the goals of campus development and it is one tool to make spaces flexible. Digitalization also provides new tools and means for learning and studying. We have professionals of this field involved in the planning.



More Q's

Will the development process have an impact on the students?

- One of the basic principles is uninterrupted operation. We aim to minimize the trouble caused by renovations, but if something occurs, we will inform you about it.
- Where will the studying premises be located in the future?
 - The aim is to plan flexible and versatile spaces around campus with different kind of study environments, both in Tervahovi and in the library.

Safe return to campus

- > The university is preparing to abandon all restrictions at the turn of the year
- We encourage students and staff to get vaccinated as recommended
- We recommend **using a face mask**, as recommended in our region by the hospital district.
- A safe distance of two metres to others is no longer required on campus.



Teaching arrangements

- If the pandemic situation allows, the university will abandon all restrictions from 1 January 2022
- Students can already use all teaching spaces in the Tervahovi and Fabriikki buildings for individual study when they are not booked for teaching or other events.
- We will increase on-campus teaching and small-group work on campus teaching arrangements can vary between the programmes
- Teaching can also be arranged in a hybrid mode (some students are on campus and some participate remotely)



Events

- Events can be organised on campus according to the following principles:
 - The event organiser is responsible for practices concerning health safety. People should only come to the event if healthy and use a face mask.
 - Indoors, there are no restrictions on the use of rooms for less than 100 people. For more than 100 people, a maximum of 75% of the capacity is recommended.
 - Outdoors, events are organised following the current recommendations and regulations of the authorities.



Exchange Studies – Application rounds

- We have over 200 partner universities in 50 countries around the world for you to select from when planning for exchange studies.
- One third of University of Vaasa students include a semester/ academic year on exchange in their degree studies.
- Application rounds for exchange in Academic year 2022-2023 (autumn semester 2022, spring semester 2023 or whole academic year 2022-2023) are:
 - 10.1.-28.1.2022 Main Application round
 All destinations in and outside Europe (Erasmus, Double Degree, Nordplus, Bilateral agreements)
 - 1.3.-13.3.2022 Complementary Application round
