

Name of the course: Ranska 1 / French 1

Code: KRAN1011

Credits: 3 ECTS

Learning outcomes:

Aim: A1.1

On completion of the course, students will be able to communicate in simple, everyday situations in both spoken and written French. They will learn to introduce themselves, ask and answer basic questions about personal information, and use common expressions for daily interactions.

Students will acquire essential vocabulary and foundational pronunciation skills, enabling them to handle routine language contexts with memorized phrases. They will also be able to write short, simple messages for daily needs and develop an understanding of key cultural aspects of French-speaking regions.

Content:

The course focuses on practical, everyday topics, emphasizing vocabulary building and essential phrases through dialogues, role-plays, and listening exercises. Key areas include introductions, numbers and conversations about familiar subjects such as studies, languages, nationalities, and everyday objects. Students will engage in activities such as listening to authentic native speech, reading simple texts, writing brief messages, and completing tasks to reinforce basic grammar. Conversational practice will center on common everyday life situations like greetings, self-introductions, and everyday exchanges, supported by multimodal materials.

Study and assessment methods:

The course requires active participation and completion of all exercises /assignments given in contact teaching and on the Moodle platform. Final examination.

Implementation methods

Online teaching. The course requires active participation and completion of all exercises/assignments given in contact teaching and on the Moodle platform. Contact teaching 30 h. At the end of the course, there will be an exam.
