Purpose of processing personal data and legal grounds for processing	The purpose of employment surveys is to monitor the early career stages of university graduates and their situation in the labour market (1-2 years for higher university degree graduates) and utilise the monitoring information in research, highlighting the early career stages of people with an academic education, the development of higher education and student guidance, as well as for offering information for potential students, current students and graduates for planning their own studies and career. In the employment survey, this information is produced and used without identification information about the participants.
	Employment surveys are carried out using both a paper form and an electronic form. The electronic response form is made available through the Elomake. The collection of research data using the paper form and the compilation of data are coordinated by Tampere University's Research Stats Service TUPA.
